MEMBERSHIP DUES

Rallies, great website, discounts, great fun and fellowship. I believe RMC Coachers provides valuable tools to help members get the most value out of their coach experiences. When 20 of your fellow members coaches arrive at a rally, we make a scene and we make it fun. Best of all we can share some great life stories and travels with our friends.

All of this comes at a minor cost each year in the form of Membership Dues. This year, the dues will be increased to \$50 per Coach. With this increase, we have made changes to procedures to actually allow members to have more conveniences. For example, members can use their credit card to Register for a rally or put down a deposit on a rally in the future – and not see an extra charge for using their credit card. If a member registers for a rally, the savings in credit card fees covers the increase in Membership Dues. But this change also helps the Treasurer, Mark Kapellusch, because the system provides more data capture for the financials and simplifies data entry when you use your credit card.

The increase in costs at nice places like San Diego are another reason for the increase. Deposits to hold a group of 20, 25 or even 30 sites is very expensive. We need to maintain a strong reserve to be able to this for our members.

Billing for Membership Dues will be around the end of December or early January.

Happy Thanksgiving. Merry Christmas. Happy Holidays. I hope to see you in San Diego or another rally in the future.
